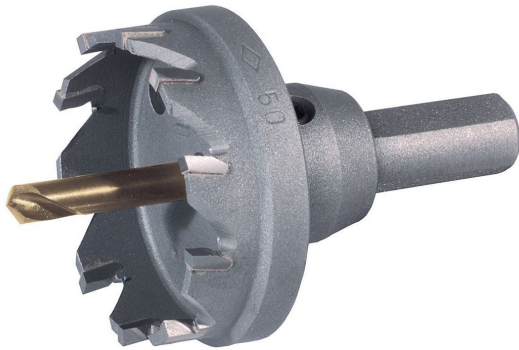

This tool is especially recommended for working with stainless steel, high-alloy steels such as V2A and V4A (up to a maximum of 2 mm), as well as steel and cast steel, light and non-ferrous metals, plastics, lightweight boards, and wood.
